


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

### INSIDE PACWEST

AN EYOTIC EYCLUSIVE WITH FUE STANGER

In an undisclosed location, thirty women and a few men, sat taking notes and raising their hands to speak. It was autumn of 2014. The group was largely comprised of women who work full or part-time as strippers in Portland. Co-workers, who recognized each other, chose close seating—although many of us had never met before.

At the front of the room, Caleb Q. Hayes was standing, smiling and speaking in an unwavering cadence trying to quell the nervousness of his audience. Hayes and his associate, Courtney Johnston, led the meeting. The two lobbyists serve PacWest, the Pacific Northwest division of National Association of Social Work. Also in attendance, were one representative from the Bureau of Labor and Industries (commonly referred to as BOLI) and Professor Stephanie Wahab of Portland State University's Department of Social Work.

We're here for you. I'm not an adult industry worker. Tell us what your concerns are and we'll listen." Courtney turned her ballpoint between her fingers, looking around the room, "And, if you don't need anything, we won't proceed with any bills. Our job is to enact change, if it is needed. So, what are some of your concerns?"

The strippers in the room aged from early twenties to mid-forties, with varying levels of formal education and experience in other fields. The meeting had been formed, after an anonymous member of OHSU had contacted a few of the strippers, at the behest of PacWest. Whisperings of unionizing, licenses and other changes, trickled through the industry. What did these people want? We soon learned what these well-intentioned outsiders thought that we needed.

- Entertainer licenses, which would be paid for by each place of employment, i.e. venue or club, required by law. The lobbyists reasoned that it would be a step in minimizing sex trafficking.

- Banning stage fees and tip out to employed staff, as part of wage protection, since no stripper in Oregon makes an hourly wage.

 - A pamphlet and test that would be given to each new hire, regarding legalities and practices— as is typical during a training portion of many other occupations.

And, yet, the lobbyists were surprised at our vehement reaction to some of these ideas. The vast majority of strippers stood vehemently against licenses. "I like my working conditions for the most part. I don't want to unionize," said a few dancers. "If you force these adult businesses to pay us an hourly wage, it will effectively shut many of them down. That's a lot of people out of work."

Other arguments by dancers op-

posing unionization, included the fact that clubs will be less likely to hire new entertainers, if it is costly to replace them—much like a tenured situation in the education system. Job security would only positively influence the dancers who don't already treat their stripping occupation as a job. And, while legally, it is unlawful to tax or penalize workers who are late, clubs do it all the time. The solution should be to stop scheduling dancers for misconduct, and rather, book only the women who show up on time.

The social workers and lobbyists were admittedly naïve to the goings-on of such a prolific industry. "But, do you think that trafficking is a problem?" asked Caleb. The answer was a resounding—NO! "If you want to discuss trafficking, let's talk about the fact that a lot of clubs don't even check the IDs of their women before they put them on stage. It would seem practical, to infer that the clubs that skirt bare minimum requirements, wouldn't enforce checking entertainer licenses as well, especially if they had to pay for them," answered one stripper.

Another woman raised her hand, "I think a lot of people think that licensing prevents trafficking, but really, I've worked in 29 clubs in Portland, and only four times, was I asked to give a form of identification during the interview process."

A few other individuals had other, long-term concerns. "I'm pursuing a career in education. If I go for a background check, a license will show up on my tax form and I will subsequently be denied employment in a field that I'm otherwise well-qualified for."

"I don't want any law enforcement to be able to look me up as an entertainer. I worry about profiling, for purposes of harassment." And, so, we began a restructuring of their original goals. Rather than tightening restrictions on businesses and entertainers, we focused on common safety concerns—poorly maintained stages and workplace harassment. In the case of employee safety regarding infrastructure, OSHA does not protect strippers, because the state does not consider them *employees*. And the Oregon Liquor License Commission only inspects areas where food and drink are prepared, which does not include the dressing room or stages.

"Some of the clubs around Portland are literally falling apart. Pieces of the ceiling come out on stage, or at another club, there's been a loose pole for years," said a dancer. It seems elementary, but keeping up to date, hygienic workspaces will minimize potential for injury and illness. A stage that is not regularly sani-

tized harbors Staph, MRSA and other bacteria, which can be transmitted by skin contact alone. Broken glass, holes in the stage and loose poles also perpetuate a precarious status quo. Injuries incurred in the club, means missed work. And, sicknesses can be transmitted amongst the staff and to the public. And, many entertainers do not have private health insurance, unless that is provided through an alternate employer or a family member.

Some of the strippers had only witnessed the poor working conditions, not actually experienced them first-hand. And, nearly half of the attendees, did not have a problem with paying stage fees. "Renting the space seems fine, but there has to be some kind of give and take. If I'm literally paying to occupy a space, I'd like that space to be hygienic and maintained."

The coalition was never in favor of unionizing or mandating licenses in order to work. And, yet, all humans in

this enormous industry might agree that there is a balance that must be struck between the individuals who supply the atmosphere and for the individuals who provide the labor. The group worked together to draft final ideas, which will be proposed to Salem legislators in the month of February. These items are:

A posted list of rights, as an entertainer, will exist in each venue. At this writing, these are still being determined.

An advocacy hotline will be available, for questions regarding work issues, such as harassment, safety and legal inquiries.

One woman spoke about the time that she walked out on her shift, after a manager threw a piece of food at her—while she was naked and dancing on the stage. Unsure of whom to contact, she reached out to an industry acquaintance, that assured her that this fell under the spectrum of unlawful work harassment.

Building maintenance codes will be enforced, regarding the structural integrity and cleanliness of entertainer areas.

Most notably, this bill is not strip club specific its goals are to ensure optimum working conditions for all live entertainers. Comedians, musicians and other live-action entertainers, would benefit from safe stages and advocate resources that these bills propose. The bill is not restricted to adult entertainers because that would be in clear violation of the First Amendment, as it relates to free speech. And, yet, the



bill has been tagged a "stripper bill," partly because the nightlife industry is so prolific, and partly because strippers were the quickest to organize and vocalize on the issue.

I spoke with Delmar Stone, the Executive Director of NASW, Oregon Chapter.

How did NASW/PacWest become involved in this effort?

Social justice is a core value of the profession of social work, and that is what this is all about to us. More and more people here in Oregon and around the world,

are gaining awareness of long-held bigotries and prejudices and how those lead to exploitation, harassment and denial of basic human rights. We hope that now is the time the majority of our legislators will rise up in defense of our sisters and brothers, our daughters and sons, working in the adult entertainment industry, who deserve workplaces that respect human rights and the protections of the law, just as much as any others.

What are ideas/intentions of any new legislation?

To enact legislation that will provide a safer workplace environment for dancers and to increase adherence to the laws that are already in place for all employees and contract workers. Adult entertainment workers have often been exploited throughout history, and we are hoping that NASW Oregon, can be a megaphone for human rights in our state. We stand together.

Who have you been working with—politically or otherwise?

We are working with anyone interested in our vision of respecting the inherent dignity and worth of every person: legislators, professors, activists, students, dancers, social workers... we're hoping more and more Oregonians will want to be part of our coalition. What changes would you like to see?

Adult entertainment workers must have a safe working environment, because that is the right thing to do. We can help create the kind of Oregon we're all proud to call home.

In summation, I'm unwilling to argue that any proposed changes won't alter the current state of the industry. And, yet, every human deserves a clean work environment and the right to

report harassment by staff and employers. Oregon already sets a creative standard for clubs all over the country. It is time that we raise the ethics bar as well.

### STRIPPERGATE - THE BARE MINIMUM

Two ex-dancers are suing the Portland strip club, Casa Diablo, for back pay and damages for alleged harassment—including unwanted touching—by patrons and the club's employees. Matilda Bickers and Amy Pitts, who each performed at Casa Diablo for about two-and-a-half years, filed suit in U.S. District Court last month. In addition to back wages and lost income, Pitts and Bickers say they're owed damages for enduring mistreatment and harassment from customers and Casa Diablo bouncers. In all, Pitts is seeking \$96,318 and Bickers will be seeking \$111,958.

When Willamette Week released the above article last month, it was the shot heard 'round the industry. Minimum wage for independent contractors? The lawsuits claims were intended as a broadside blast to Johnny Zukle's flagship, Casa Diablo, but the industry itself is under fire—as it has been many times before. Maybe it would be better if we all just look at this industry with the following mentality strip club = fight club. They should share the same rules—the first being, don't talk about strip club especially your wages or lack thereof. The Oregon adult entertainment industry has been accused of having a "wild west mentality," when it comes to regulations in strip clubs. Back then, industry conflicts were settled within, rather than attracting the attention of government agencies and tax bureaus, when a couple of opportunistic attorneys play knight-in-

take their fees, percentages and retainers, a stage fee is going to look like chump change.

This lawsuit is the act of two individuals. It is in no way connected to the recently-exposed story, that a group of strippers were working together with lobbyists, legislators and social workers, to draft a new set of industry regulations slated to hit the House floor for a vote in a legislative session taking place

in Salem this month. Seeing as how one of Exotic's contributors is part of that session (see PACWEST on pg. 28), the issue of "a mimimum wage for dancers" is not even on the table. Nearly all dancers are happy with the way things are right now. The only dancers who aren't happy, are the ones that are only making \$40 a night and have to pay anywhere from a \$10 to \$50 stage fee.

Let's cut to the chase here...if you're only making \$40 a shift, you should consider the following:

You shouldn't be a stripper.

You're working in an establishment that used to be a country bar that lost their lottery and tried to replace the revenue by putting strippers on a shitty stage in the corner, next to the jukebox.

If you used to make a shit-ton of cash when you first started, but you're barely able to clear a bill now, consider this—you're too old.

Tips and table dances...taxes


Bathroom needs cleaning...you are an employee... get on it

And, mandatory tip out is no longer a set house fee... now it becomes a percentage

Actually changed a couple of their minds

I was renting half a house from this lady (36-years old) that wanted to get a job cocktail waitressing at strip club. I tried to tell her it wasn't happening, as nicely as I could, before she went out trying. She ended up talking to a friend of mine that was at Casa at the time. When she found out she would be expected to be, at bare minimum topless, she told me, "I'm calling the ACLU and suing them. They are trying to force me to be nude." Um...no, they wouldn't even have wanted you to be nude and they didn't force you to do anything, YOU never even worked there. Needless to say, she couldn't sue them. She could, however, win an award for being one of the bestestfunctioning retards out there.

You girls need to unionize, you're artists, not sex objects. I sure would like to help your cause, but I am now crippled and living in Tigard. Also, dancers make



pretty decent money. The power needs to be shifted to the worker, not to the company. It is clear that the dancers are employees. For all the harassment they endure, they should a minimum of \$12 an hour, plus tips. Unionize girls!

I have seen the business model for clubs with "employee strippers," as I work in the industry and I'm here to state, for the record, that unless you are a low-earning "day shift" girl, you won't like it. Trust me on this one. This is being pushed through by girls that no longer dance anymore and have a beef with their previous clubs. This is going to do nothing but hurt everyone's money and the clubs won't even blink. You think you don't like the fees now? Wait until you are on the payroll. You'll be lucky to get 50% of your tips and dances. If an owner is paying you to do your job, and part of that job is you collecting money from customers (who are now their customers btw because you work for the owner and not yourself any longer), they would take all of your money and pay you a commission. In addition to that, an owner could then require that you show up on time, meet a dress code, perform other job-related duties (dishes, bathroom cleaning, cocktail serving, door hosting, etc.) work a set schedule (that you don't get a say in), among a myriad of other trifling details. There is a reason that the majority of these cases are being pushed by ex- strippers, because they don't care about the fall-out, and as usual, are looking at the short-term monetary reward. The smart dancers, in my experience, the girls that work hard, have a good work ethic and make money, do NOT want to see this, because they know what it will mean for their business.

From a business point of view, I've always felt that it would make more sense to have the dancers on payroll, as it would provide nothing but a benefit to the clubs. The ones getting hurt by this change, will ultimately be the entertainers, as they are going to be forgoing all that cash. Say goodbye to dance money...you get paid to do that. Tips will likely still happen, but employers will then be obligated to report those tips to the IRS—as you would now be a paid employee, and if they don't report that income, they would face penalties themselves. If you've ever been a "tipped employee" on payroll, then you know how badly that stings on your paycheck—if you even receive one.

I'm pulling for people to keep making money, as that is how I also m a k e m y



living. This new trend of disgruntled dancers suing clubs for back wages is only going to hurt the business. People that oppose our industry are rejoicing at this trend. "Yeah, let'em all shut down!" Is that really what we want?

If I am required to employ dancers and pay them a minimum wage, I will also require them to perform duties around the club. They will also be held accountable to scheduling needs of the club—no longer of their own. If I'm forced to treat dancers as employees, I will force employee work upon them, such as waitressing, cleaning, etc. Forcing clubs to treat dancers as employees and pay them a minimum wage, will harm the industry. I can all but promise you, the majority of clubs will have fewer than 10 dancers on a shift and drink/food prices, as well as cover charges, will skyrocket. They touch on the legislature being talked about. Unfortunately, nobody but dancers were invited to the talks. Not bouncers, DJs, bartenders, waitresses, cooks, managers or owners—just dancers. It will be biased legislature. And, once we're required to hire dancers, we'll have enough employees to have to offer medical benefits.

THANKS OBAMA!!!!!

This is a voluntary society. You are not entitled to more than you are offered.

If you are not happy with what you are offered, you can voluntarily leave, as you voluntarily came. This is true for hourly, salary, contract or commission employment, and the variations thereof.

If your entitlement is a claim to a small wage, that is a pittance of the exorbitant cash take home of the previous compensation (more than most doctors or attorneys make after 50+ hour weeks), then you're not a very good poster child for "workers' rights." Waiting to complain, until you've decided it's to your monetary gain, is bottom-feeding.

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



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
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





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
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












"So...maybe I could see you out in the real world some time."

A lot of people tend to think that strippers have deadbeat boyfriends (okay, some of you really do) or that all strippers are floating through life in the limbo of single-hood, which is preposterous. When folks hear just how domestic some of us can be, they are for some reason shocked.

Monogamous married life worked quite nicely for a couple years, until the Husband and I felt the desire to expand on our sexual adventures. There is a significant difference between sex and love—much like there's a difference between a strip tease on a stage and the manner in which I remove my clothing with for my lover(s) in private.

As explained by sex educator, Tristan Taormino, in her book *Opening Up; A Guide to Creating and Sustaining Open Relation-ships*, there are a handful of different types of open relationships such as polyamory, polyfidelity, swinging, solo polyamory and partnered non-monogamy. For simplicity's sake, I will refer to any relationship other than monogamous as "open."

Open relationships can take *work*. Communication, humility and respect for personal space, are necessary for open relation-

ships. These things prove difficult enough for many conventional relationships!

There are 7.5 billion people in the world.

Two months ago, sex educator and author, Janet Hardy, spoke at the Alberta Theater in NE Portland. The room was stuffed with 400 attendees of all genders, aged 21-70ish. As the author of a dozen books on BDSM, she is most famous for "The Ethical Slut." Originally published in 1994, the now-60-year-old Hardy, remarked on the still-newness of non-monogamy in the United States. "At this time, only about one dozen books exist regarding open relationships."

Hardy pointedly referred to the American habit of romanticizing the possession of another human being, "The notion of referring to your partners as your better half, it seems cutesy, until you realize that means

that without that person, you are incomplete. So, what? So, you're only half a person unless you are coupled? Well, that's depressing. You have to love yourself as a whole person, regardless of your relationships."

Sex workers support personal autonomy, because it supports us: Your body is your own and you only lend your time and experiences to people. Deciding what type of open relationship that you and your partner(s) desire, depends on your sexual and emotional needs, as well as lifestyle and daily routines.

Do you and your partner enjoy watching other couples fuck and fucking other people at social gatherings? You probably fall into the *swinger* category. Did you get the green light to hook up with other women, when you go out of town on business trips? That sounds more like *partnered non-monogamy*. Are you currently dating and sleeping with a married woman, and her husband doesn't mind? Congratulations, you are engaging in *solo-polyamory*. And, while labels for your relationship type aren't necessary for engaging in an open relationship, they do make it slightly simpler to explain to outsiders.

Some people claim that open couples are "oversexed." But, what does that mean? What is healthy? Is a married man masturbating to porn every single day on his laptop healthy? Is an openly-married man, having sex with multiple partners on his allotted date night, healthy? Which is better? Worse? As long as these individuals are happy with their choices, either scenario is healthy.

Regarding health, regular testing for STIs and STDs is an obvious necessity. Pregnancy prevention is available in a multitude of forms. And, if you're tough enough to get a tattoo, it's no trouble to visit Planned Parenthood twice a year for a blood draw. Don't forget to donate!

I caught his fingers and held them firmly between my two palms, patted his hand and smiled sweetly. "I do not, sir. My pussy, like my calendar, fills up pretty fast."

# A little piece of hell in Southeast Portland...





I laughed a lot reading the book, and there were a few moments, when tears came to my eyes. There is something for everyone within the pages—strippers and non-strippers alike. It's inspiring, too, knowing that all across the country, the stripper literati is alive and well!

I got a chance to turn the tables on Elle and talk to her about her latest literary endeavor.

# I read Strange Times in one sitting. The variety and quality of the stories, kept me hooked. How did you go about collecting stories from across the country?

Thank you! I'm really pleased to hear that. I loved receiving them. In order to solicit stories from strippers thousands of miles away, I relied on social media; Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and of course, the secret web of stripper networks.

## How did this project begin?

I got sick of seeing strippers portrayed as one particular archetype, years ago. We aren't all in need of rescue, but not every woman is a heroine either. The women, who work on these stages, are as unique, odd and varied, as the clubs and the patrons. Some of us, are struggling with our demons—some of us are the demons.

# You're a writer as well and you have two pieces in the book. Do you have any advice for other writers out there, who are seeking an audience?

My advice; learn to edit. I need to take a writing class. I use way too many semicolons. If you really examine the syntax and diction of my works, I think you'll discover that I'm not a trained writer—and, it shows. I have to look shit up on Google all the time. I hate to refer to myself as a writer. I'm a storyteller. I watch people. I listen to what they don't say. I listen to what they are afraid to verbalize. That's why people like to speak with me—because I listen, but, I can also keep them entertained. You don't have to buy a ticket to another city, if you want to find an adventure. Just keep your eyes open. Stories are unfolding all around you. Look for them.

## Do you have a favorite chapter?

I was thrilled with each piece, but "Jersey Girl" was a catharsis for a couple reasons. I transcribed the piece, as the woman, Felicity Hazel, told me her story over the phone, from 3,000 miles away. She dropped out of high school and her writing is rife with typos and slang, so submitting a finished piece was really daunting to her. I opted to type it for her, and she trusted me to tell the story, about the time a client almost killed her. That took

incredible trust. Also, when she received a copy, she sent me a message saying that she felt that the demons of her past had finally left her. All she needed, was to tell her story with no judgments. That was a gift for both of us.

## I liked the blend of fact and fiction, with a poetry break in the middle. Did you set out to publish in this format?

I kinda wanted to break some of the rules. I wanted the women to be able to use words that came from an honest place—even if little bits were fantasized. I mean, on a bad night at work, I fantasize about lighting people on fire. I'd never do it, but the feelings aren't any less real. I actually got a bad review on Amazon, from a reader who said that she couldn't stand the format. And, that's fine. I want you to read it, as if the women are sitting in front of you. I want you to hear their voices.

## What is your hope for the book?

I want people to glean some kind of insight into the dynamic industry that I call my life. Stripping is rarely portrayed accurately in television, movies or music. We aren't wind-up dolls that simply dance, drink and laugh. Some of the funniest conversations I've ever witnessed have taken place after hours, in the dressing room or between a client and myself, in a quiet lap dance room. It's not about what happens on the stage. Stage is performance, and life, is not a performance.

## Should we expect more of these anthologies from you in the future?

If people buy the first one! Really though, I've received emails from strippers who hadn't heard about the project and are asking to be included in a second. I'd love to have them. Semicolons and all.

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


like every other electronic gaming platform in that multiple producers are all competing to put out the best possible system at the best prices, which will all

a sticker on it that says, "WARNING! EXPLOSIONS OF PURE BLISS IMMINENT— GUSHING MAY OCCUR."







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
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
