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
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


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# READER OF TO CONTINUE INTERIOR DO TO CONTINUE

Fantasy and prose poetry offer solace, but the ghost of Orpheus still makes a mess of me.







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
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# **Diary of a Pet Fiend** Memoirs of a Veterinary Assistant [Part 1]
